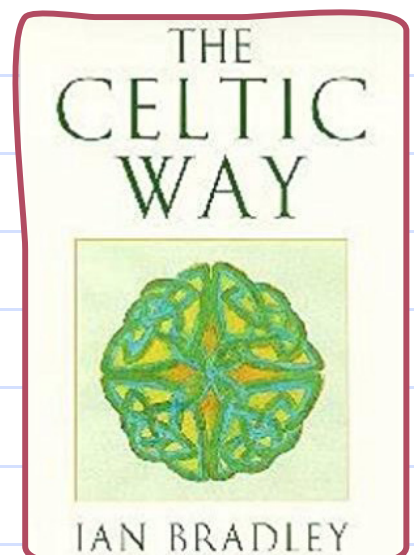
Ian Bradley is Emeritus Professor of Cultural and Spiritual History at the University of St Andrews.
